

GLOBAL LEARNING

Global learning in Washington takes a variety of forms: from highly institutionalized international campuses and field studies, to less institutionalized faculty-led study abroad programs and partnerships with universities around the world. Some Washington campuses have set ambitious goals to have 50% of their students go abroad; others have established degree programs that require international language acquisition, courses, study abroad, or service learning. In all cases, Washington's higher education programs consider global learning to be more than educational tourism. Emblematic programs offer students opportunities to learn about the global forces that affect everyday lives, experiences that allow them to make global interconnections in local settings different from those of their own communities, and develop the competencies needed to engage productively both locally and globally.
